Discuss Retention Pond Current Condition

City Administrator Chris Moonis stated the City Commission is requesting the Board research what is happening at the retention pond, to find out what the potential cause or causes are and what the recommended solutions may be. The Commission would like the Utility Board to have a Stormwater study done to determine the cause and possible remediation of the issue.

Board members discussed their opinions, ideas, the current tide trends, and the fact that the area was used as a staging debris site after Hurricane Irma. They also discussed the possibility of eliminating the retention pond. Greg Burke of 621 8th Street addressed the Board. He stated that after the Hurricane Irma cleanup the rock was compacted too much, making the area like a concrete pad. He believes a percolation test should be done to determine if the area drains.

Motion – Moved by Chair John Dalton, seconded by Steve Flood, to request Mittauer & Associates prepare a proposal to provide options with costs and procedures to correct the problem, and also the possibility of elimination of the retention pond.
