Ordinance No. 2018-456

AN ORDINANCE BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF KEY COLONY BEACH AMENDING THE CITY OF KEY COLONY BEACH CODE OF ORDINANCES TO STRIKE ARTICLE VIII – FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT OF THE LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS AND ADOPT A NEW ARTICLE VIII – FLOODPLAIN MANAGEMENT; TO ADOPT FLOOD HAZARD MAPS, TO DESIGNATE A FLOODPLAIN ADMINISTRATOR, TO ADOPT PROCEDURES AND CRITERIA FOR DEVELOPMENT IN FLOOD HAZARD AREAS, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES; TO AMEND LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS ARTICLE II – DEFINITIONS; TO AMEND LAND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS ARTICLE XIV – NONCONFORMITIES; TO AMEND CODE OF ORDINANCES CHAPTER 6 – BUILDINGS TO ADOPT ADMINISTRATIVE AND TECHNICAL AMENDMENTS TO THE FLORIDA BUILDING CODE; PROVIDING FOR APPLICABILITY; SEVERABILITY; AND AN EFFECTIVE DATE. Second Reading.

Attorney Wright read Ordinance 2018-456 by title only. There are copies of the entire ordinance available for the audience at the back of the City Hall Auditorium.

Presentation/Explanation of Ordinance Building Official Borysiewicz explained the City currently has a flood plain ordinance that has been existence for many years. The Florida Building code, effective January 1, 2018, requires all new buildings must be built to the FEMA flood plain requirement plus one foot. This FEMA requirement, in addition to the inclusion of the Florida Building Codes, are in this ordinance. This ordinance will assure the City's compliance with FEMA and the Florida Building Codes. The definitions of substantial damage and substantial improvements remain the same. For example, if a structure is damaged more than 50% of the construction value it can be rebuilt in the same foot print and with the same density. This was one very important item that was not changed.

Recommendation of 2018-456 Concerning Flood Plain Management of the Land Development Regulations. No comment from the Planning and Zoning Board.


