1. **Call to Order, Pledge of Allegiance, and Roll Call:** The emergency meeting of the Key Colony Beach City Commission was called to order by Mayor DeNeale at 10:30 a.m. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

2. **General Update:** Mayor DeNeale reported the most recent update from the daily mayors call he attended that morning. Mayor DeNeale stated the Department of Health is not inclined to reopen anything until Monroe County goes 2 weeks without any new Covid-19 cases. Based on communications, the consensus is the Governor will likely not tolerate the State being closed passed the end of April. The mayors in South Florida being Miami-Dade, Broward, West Palm Beach and Monroe County held there first virtual meeting to begin coordination of re-opening. At the meeting Monroe County Mayor Carruthers stated Monroe County's actions would depend on the other counties because they are the hot spot therefore Monroe County must use caution reopening. If the check point continues there could be a soft reopening by opening things such as parks, beaches and then restaurants at 50% capacity possibly in a couple weeks. However, that will be contingent on the Governor and South Florida Mayors. Mayor DeNeale instructed City Administrator Moonis to contact all restaurant owners in Key Colony Beach to get their opinion on the possible soft opening.

3. **Extension of Declaration of Local Emergency:** The Commission reviewed the 6th Declaration of Local State of Emergency.
