

At the Key Colony Beach City Commission Special Meeting on Thursday, April 28th 2022, with a vote of 3 to 1, Beth Ramsay Vickrey was sworn in as the newest City of Key Colony Beach Commissioner; she will fill the vacancy on the commission until the regular elections in November. Beth has stated her intention to run in November to retain her seat on the KCB City Commission.

Beth Ramsay Vickrey is a long-time Monroe County resident who grew up in, and went to school in Marathon, and spent 16 years in the Lower Keys. Beth says she's found her forever home in Key Colony Beach, calling it "a truly special place, where community is the priority".

Beth's relevant qualifications reach across business, community, and governmental lines with more than 15 years extensive business experience, and more than 16 years actively engaged in Monroe County government, politics, and policy.

She served six years on the Keys Energy Advisory Board, and she also served four years as the Monroe County District II Planning Commissioner. And she currently sits on the County's library advisory board.

Beth says her passion is animal health, welfare and rescue; as such she's spent more than ten years as a volunteer at the Fl Key SPCA, Marathon Campus.
