Florida Keys







- northeast over the northwest Caribbean Sea and southeast Gulf of Mexico.
- develops, however...
  - the pre-dawn hours Friday and continue into early Saturday.
  - Rain squalls with locally strong wind gusts late Thursday night through early Saturday
  - frequent gusts over 30 mph Friday through Saturday.
- your concerns include areas and streets prone to rainfall flooding.

There is an increasing potential for flooding rainfall from early Friday through early Saturday in the Florida Keys.

Low pressure near the Yucatan Peninsula is expected to gradually develop into a tropical depression over the next couple of days. There is a high chance for tropical cyclone development over the next 24 hours as it moves slowly

Any potential weather impacts to the Florida Keys will remain highly uncertain until a well-defined center of circulation

The threat of heavy rainfall with a slight risk for excessive, flooding rains in the Florida Keys may begin as early as

General windy conditions throughout the Florida Keys, with sustained winds near 20 to occasionally 25 mph with



- Broad low pressure near the Yucatan Peninsula has a high chance for developing into a tropical depression over the next 48 hours.
- It is expected to move northeast over the northwest Caribbean Sea and southeast Gulf of Mexico during the next couple of days.
- **Reminder**: The hatched area represents a possible development area, not the system's path after development occurs.








### **Current Satellite View**

Low Pressure near the Yucatan



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
- The large, loosely-organized low pressure system contains a large area of showers and thunderstorms well to the east over the northwest Caribbean Sea.
- Heavy weather in form of squalls capable of producing very heavy rainfall is likely extend well to the east of any potential developing center of circulation.











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- The Florida Keys have been outlooked for a slight risk for excessive, flooding rainfall for Friday and Friday night.
- This risk may linger in the **Upper Florida Keys** Saturday.











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
