

# Wastewater Sampling Update for Concern Virus's – January 01, 2024

## Overview of the 3 main viruses being tracked by CDC and State of Florida Health Department:

- Covid-19 Low levels, increasing levels Southeast Florida, and Monroe County
- Influenza A H1N1 High levels, overall State is increasing; Southeast Florida area is increasing.
- RSV low levels, Florida is decreasing.





### ✓ SARS-CoV-2 Virus – Covid -19

  - CDC Hospitalizations Summary 281 cases, 28.3 % increase from last week (Broward, Miami-Dade, and Monroe County data together, data through 23De23).
  - Florida Department of Health Weekly Situation Report (data as of 22De23):
    - Overall State of Florida 11,720 new cases (increasing)
      - Monroe County 29 new cases (increasing)
      - Dade County 2,043 new cases (increasing)
      - Broward County 1,137 new cases (increasing)

### A Weekly Influenza Surveillance Report Prepared by the Influenza Division

#### Outpatient Respiratory Illness Activity Map Determined by Data Reported to ILINet

This system monitors visits for respiratory illness that includes fever plus a cough or sore throat, also referred to as ILI, not laboratory confirmed influenza and may capture patient visits due to other respiratory pathogens that cause similar symptoms.

<sup>\*</sup>This map uses the proportion of outpatient visits to healthcare providers for influenza-like illness to measure the ILI activity level within a state. It does not, however, measure the extent of geographic spread of flu within a state. Therefore, outbreaks occurring in a single city could cause the state to display high activity levels.
