Dear Residents.

The City is conducting routine Waterway Safety and Marine Structure Inspections throughout Key Colony Beach. These inspections help us keep our canals safe and ensure that waterfront structures remain in good condition for everyone's use and enjoyment.

# **Inspection Focus Areas**

### 1. Waterway Safety (Docks & Lifts)

As part of the inspection process, please take a moment to check the following:

- House Numbers: Make sure your street address is visible from the waterway to assist with emergency response.
- Submerged Lifts: If your lift cradle remains in the water, please attach a visible buoy or marker to help prevent boating hazards.
- Raised Lifts: For fully elevated lift cradles, please place visible reflectors on the structure so they can be easily seen.

These are standard safety measures included in City Ordinances 5-43, Sec. 5-62, and Secs. 6-50, 6-51, & 6-52.

### 2. Seawall Condition


The City will also review seawalls to ensure they remain structurally sound and meet current maintenance expectations outlined in the City Code.
